It is the understanding of the parties that maintenance of municipal grounds shall include the following:

1. Mowing:

- a. Mowing shall occur at least once a week at each location during the following schedule
 - i. July through October 2020
 - ii. March through October 2021
 - iii. March through October 2022
 - iv. March through June 2023
- b. Depending on the rate of grass growth, some locations my require twice a week mowing.
- c. Limbs and debris shall be removed before cutting begins.
- d. Lawn areas shall be cut with a rotary-type mower when both soil and grass are dry. Areas that can not be cut with a rotary-type mower shall be cut with a string-type trimmer. Trimming shall be done immediately following the cutting.
- e. The hedges and shrubs are to be trimmed and/or pruned as need to maintain a high-quality appearance.
- f. The parking lots and walkways are to be cleaned after grass cutting

2. Pesticide Application:

It is the understanding of the parties that maintenance of municipal cemetery grounds shall include the following:

1. Mowing:

- a. Mowing shall occur at least once a week at each location during the following schedule
 - i. July through October 2020
 - ii. March through October 2021
 - iii. March through October 2022
 - iv. March through June 2023
- b. Schedule shall provide for mowing to be completed during the week prior to Easter Sunday, Mother's Day and Father's Day
- c. Mowing height shall be a minimum of three (3) inches to three and one-half (3 ½) inches
- d. Mowing shall occur every fourteen (14) days or when grass reaches a height of five inches (5").
- e. Mowing shall cease prior to and during all funerals.
- f. Limbs and debris shall be removed before cutting begins.
- g. Lawn areas shall be cut with a rotary-type mower when both soil and grass are dry. Areas that cannot be cut with a rotary-type mower shall be cut with a string-type trimmer. Trimming shall be done immediately following the cutting.
- h. The hedges and shrubs are to be trimmed and/or pruned as need to maintain a high-quality appearance.
- i. The parking lots and walkways are to be cleaned after grass cutting

It is the understanding of the parties that maintenance of these areas shall include the following:

1. Mowing:

- a. Mowing shall occur at least every two weeks at each location during the following schedule
 - i. July through October 2020
 - ii. March through October 2021
 - iii. March through October 2022
 - iv. March through June 2023
- b. Depending on the rate of grass growth, some locations my require additional mowing.
- c. Limbs and debris shall be removed before cutting begins.
- d. Lawn areas shall be cut with a rotary-type mower when both soil and grass are dry. Areas that cannot be cut with a rotary-type mower shall be cut with a string-type trimmer. Trimming shall be done immediately following the cutting.
- e. The hedges and shrubs are to be trimmed and/or pruned as need to maintain a high-quality appearance.
- f. The parking lots and walkways are to be cleaned after grass cutting

2. Pesticide Application:
